SYNOPSIS

The story of "TRUCE" began on Christmas Eve 1914, when German troops began decorating the area around their trenches in the region of Ypres, Belgium, for Weihnachten (Christmas). They placed candles on trees then continued the celebration by singing Christmas carols, most notably Stille Nacht (Silent Night). The British troops in the trenches across from them responded by singing English carols. The two sides shouted Christmas greetings to each other. Soon there after, visits across the "No Man's Land" took place, where the soldiers exchanged small gifts of whisky, jam, cigars, chocolate, sometimes addresses, and drank together. The artillery in the region fell silent that night.

The truce also allowed burial parties a breathing spell to retrieve recently-fallen soldiers and bring them back behind their own lines. Proper burials took place as soldiers from both sides mourned the dead together and paid their respects, in spite of opposition at higher levels of the military. The truce spread to other areas of the lines, and there are many stories of soccer matches between the opposing forces. It lasted everywhere through Christmas night and in some areas, continued until New Year's Day.

Our story begins with sights and sounds of pre-war Europe as we are drawn into the overture. We meet Constance and Jonathan our British couple first, then Inge, Christian and Karl the German Family. How does the war affect all of their lives? Michael Taylor's poign ant portrayal of this amazing historical event allows us to experience this as well.

Michael Barrientos (Ensemble) makes his Mission City Opera debut. A computer science grad student by day and singer by night (and by shower), Michael has performed with a cappella and choral groups at UC Berkeley and Stanford. He has also been a chorus member with Berkeley Opera and West Bay Opera.

Brandon Keith Biggs (Kenny) makes his MCO debut in Truce. He is a blind, 18 year old bass-baritone. He studies with Carl Franzen and performs in his monthly concerts. Brandon has performed in numerous musicals and charity events around the Silicon Valley. Brandon's immediate goal is to major in opera at a four-year college.

Norman DeVol (Gunther) is an accomplished soloist from San Francisco Peninsula currently living in San Bruno . He received his B.A. in voice from San Jose State University where he studied with Jeanne Garson, Norman has performed with professional symphonies and opera companies throughout Northern California, including the Sacramento Symphony, Auburn Symphony, Apollo Opera, Camellia Symphony, Monterey Symphony, Opera La Piccola Scala, Mission City Opera, Pocket Opera, West Bay Opera and Berkeley Opera. Reviewing a recent performance of Mozart's Die Zauberflote, the Santa Clara WEEKLY called him "the vocal standout of the evening. His clear and flexible voice rang from beginning to end with strength, stability, and true artistry, as one hopes to hear in a heroic Tamino. One sensed the experience and knowledge behind every nuance, and true artistic respect for each famous note." Norman's interpretation of Rodolphe in the Piccola Scala production of La Boheme garnered him a nomination for a Sacramento regional theater Elly Award. When he's not singing, Norman also teaches voice privately, is a choral director and accompanist. He is currently the assistant conductor of the internationally acclaimed Masterworks Chorale based at the College of San Mateo and is a member of the San Francisco Opera Chorus.

Adam Flowers (Lt. Worthing) A Northern California native, has appeared in opera houses and concert halls across North America and Asia. Recently Mr. Flowers performed the role of Cavaradossi in "Tosca" at Phoenix Hall in Osaka, Japan in July of 2010 and Edgardo in North Bay Opera 's production of "Lucia di Lammermoor" in the March of 2010. Mr. Flowers has performed in the regular chorus at San Francisco Opera for the 2010-2011 season and was a resident artist at Opera San Jose from 2001-2006, where he performed over 35 leading tenor roles. He currently studies with Deborah Benedict at her vocal studio in Corte Madera, California.

Dan Galpin (Timothy) is glad to be back in the trenches. He's also perforr:ned the roles of Basilio (La nozze di Figaro), Goro (Madama Butterfly), and Pa pageno (Die Zauberflute) with Mission City. His credits include the title role in Le Nozze di Figaro, Silvio (Pagliacci), the Father (Hansel and Gretel), Schaunard (La Boheme), Escamillo, Le Dancaire and Morales (Carmen), Frank (Die Fledermaus), Baron Douphol (La Traviata), Perichaud (La Rondine), Yamadori (Madama Butterfly), Amantio (Gianni Schicchi) as well as Guglielmo (Cosi fan tutte) and Almaviva (Nozze di Figaro). Mr. Joggerst performed recitals of Schumann's Dichterliebe, Liederkreis and Beethoven's An die ferne Geliebte in London as well as the Christmas Oratorio (Saint-Saens) and Vaughan Williams' Serenade to Music. Future engagements include the title role in Mission City Opera's upcoming production of Don Giovanni. Mercutio in Gounod's Romeo and Juliette. Morales in Carmen as well as soloist appearances with the Saint Saens Christmas Oratorio and Brahms' Liebeslieder. Mr. Joggerst has been a studio artist at Opera San Jose and a student at the International Vocal Arts Institute in Montreal, Canada, He holds degrees from The Royal Academy of Music in London and the Conservatory of Music Lubeck.

Sharon Kaye (Executive Producer) has performed in the US, Europe, and Pacific Rim with musical groups such as the San Francisco Lyric Opera, Livermore Valley Opera, San Jose Lyric Theatre, and Mission City Opera. She has also sung with the Grammy-Award-Winning San Francisco Symphony and the San Francisco Opera Choruses. Her roles include the Dames of Gilbert

& Sullivan to Verdi's Azucena, from Strauss' Octavian to Ward's Elizabeth Proctor and from Moore's Augusta Tabor to Carmen and Dalila. Sharon's CD, Classic Christmas, highlights her long relationship with master vocal coach, Russell Norman, and she has also been invited to record with the Bulgarian Radio Orchestra in Sophia. Sharon is an active member of the American Guild of Musical Artists, and she ·served as president of the National Association of Teachers of Singing of the Bay Area for four years. Sharon enjoys working with private school children in San Jose as well as with Gorin School of Music in Mountain View as well as maintaining her vocal studio in Sunnyvale. She founded Mission City Opera in 1996 and currently serves as the opera 's general director.

Erin Lahm (Constance) has been actively performing in the San Francisco Bay Area since moving here in 2008. Ms. Lahm is delighted to be appearing as Constance in this production, a role she created for the world premiere last season. She made her debut with Mission City Opera in 2009 as Barbarina in Mozart's Le Nozze di Figaro. In the 2008-09 season, she appeared with the San Francisco Cabaret Opera in John Bilotta's Quantum Mechanic, Purcell's Dioclesian, and Mark Alburger's Antigone. Ms. Lahm has made numerous appearances as a soloist with Bay Area Classical Harmonies performing the soprano solos in pieces such as Bach's Cantata No. 147 and 140, Pergolesi's Stabat Mater, and Handel's Chanda No. 8. Over the course of two summers. Ms. Lahm was a resident artist at the Ezio Pinza Council for American Singers of Opera in Oderzo, Italy where she performed in a series of concerts, throughout the area. She is a new resident of Santa Clara and is currently the choral music director at Archbishop Mitty High School in San Jose.

Ping Li (Ensemble) began singing in 2009 in the Silicon Valley Performing Arts Group in Santa Clara, a Chinese choir . He has been studying under Ying Wang, a principal singer from the Chinese national opera house. Though this is Ping's first performance in an opera, he is very excited to join Mission City Opera this season.

Radu Licea (Berthold) is excited to be in the Truce of Carols ensemble. He enjoyed as well singing as a tenor in the Chorus of Mission City Opera in Le Nozze di Figaro and La Boheme.

Tom McGourin (Ensemble) acted at Santa Clara University. He has performed in all of MCO's productions, and in four recent Lyric Theatre productions. He has also performed in several movies and TV show episodes. He is on the Board of Directors of MCO and two other arts nonprofits. He is the Cast Manager for Truce.

Mr. Taylor's stage directing and conducting credits include both opera and musical theater with many companies in San Francisco Bay Area, including the Lyric Theater of San Jose and Livermore

Valley Opera. He directed and conducted Mission City Opera's premier production of Johann Strauss' opera "Die Fledermaus," and has conducted or directed most of the company's opera performances since then, including the company's annual Christmas show, "Amahl and the Night Visitors." While "Truce of Carols" is his first opera, Mr. Taylor's composing history includes many choral works, as well a student musical, Kids of the Rock, commissioned by the Nueva School in Hillsboro, CA.
